
Through engaging verse and illustrations, Born to Wear Blue helps kids understand how firefighters protect and serve while teaching valuable lessons about what to do in emergency situations.

# Message from the Board of Directors Chairman

Dear Members,

For those that haven't heard, Joe Mirachi, our esteemed Chief Executive Officer (CEO) for four years, has resigned and is taking on increased challenges as the CEO of a larger

credit union in Florida. Although the Board recognizes that Joe's superior leadership and technical skills have helped cement the reputation of TOPCU as one of the leading credit unions of its size, we also recognize that change is inevitable and wish Joe and his wife Donna happiness and success as they begin this new stage in their lives.

The day that Joe informed the Board of his decision, we agreed on a phased process for the selection of the individual who will lead TOPCU into the future. Knowing that this process is not one that comes quickly, step one was identifying an Interim CEO that possesses both the leadership qualities that the staff and members expect and the skills to provide a seamless transition. Another requirement is for this individual to provide the Board a degree of mentorship as we begin the plan for selection of a permanent CEO. Fortunately, this process did not take long and the ideal candidate was hired within two weeks of Joe's announcement. Several candidates were identified and, through a unanimous decision by the Board, Jim Knoff was selected as our Interim CEO with an effective date of August 1.

Jim's reputation and skills are unprecedented in the credit union community. He's been in the business since 1966 and a CEO for 26 years in Tucson prior to his retirement. Based on this history, Jim fully understands the needs and requirements of our members and is intimately familiar with TOPCU's unique history, vision and mission. We also look forward to his advice as we move forward in the selection process for the permanent CEO.

Step two is currently in progress. The Board is working with Heather Lane, Human Resources Director, to insure this opening is advertised throughout the credit union community. This announcement process began on August 1. Application material and resumes were due on August 31.

Upon completion of this step, the Board will review submissions and meet in early October to begin the process of refining the applicant pool for more in-depth, personal interviews. We estimate the timeframe for the overall selection process to be approximately six months.

TOPCU also said goodbye earlier this year to Russ Hanson, our Chief Financial Officer (CFO), who decided to retire. TOPCU has been fortunate to fill the CFO position on an interim basis with Lorrie Firth who has more than 20 years experience in credit unions. Lorrie's experience will help us bridge the gap until a permanent CFO is hired.

I'm confident that the Board and TOPCU staff accurately defined the ingredients required to maintain our focus on taking care of you, the member, even during this time of change.
